

You may have dreamed at some time of a land where everything was strange, where the animals did things that you read of in fairy tales, and where the trees and birds forgot the time of year. Should you travel, you could find a real topsy-turvy land in a jungle on a peninsula in Asia.

In this jungle there are no marked seasons. In one tree you may find birds nesting, and in the next tree birds of the same kind shedding their feathers; or you will see one tree with ripe fruit and a neighboring tree of the same kind beginning to blossom.

There are butterflies more than a foot wide. One small bird sleeps upside down. The male of another kind of bird sits on the eggs while his wife fights his battles for him. Fish hop, skip, and jump on the ground, and then climb trees. Later they may be seen walking down the trees to take a bath in a convenient pool. Crabs eat coconut, fish eat living coral, and rats live in the tops of tall trees.
